KEY FACTS

More than 14.5 million people are now displaced as a result of the conflicts in Syria and Iraq.

The humanitarian appeal for Syria in 2016 was only 43% funded, while the Syrian refugee and resilience plan for support to neighbouring countries was only funded at 55%. The Iraq 2016 appeal is 70% funded.

Faced with limited international support and huge strains on their economies, the countries neighbouring Syria are increasing the entry restrictions for Syrian refugees and people are being turned back at the borders.

More than 13.5 million people inside Syria are in need of assistance- with major access constraints restricting delivery of assistance to many vulnerable populations. Despite repeated UN resolutions mandating access to humanitarian assistance, bureaucratic and administrative challenges created by authorities, attacks on humanitarian workers and active conflict continue to hamper the relief effort, according to the NRC report "Fuelling the Fire".

Also in Iraq many civilians in conflict areas have limited access to assistance.


TURKEY











NRC works with Turkish education partners to deliver vocational training, job matching services and cash support that allow refugee and Turkish youth to secure a sustainable income for themselves.

NRC will offer information services, counselling and legal assistance to ensure refugees enjoy legal protection and are able to access the rights and services that they are legally entitled to;

Through the provision of cash assistance, NRC helps the most vulnerable families meet their basic needs (food, shelter, household and hygiene items).

In Ankara city, NRC is the largest international provider of humanitarian goods and services.

LEBANON









NRC is the main provider of shelter solutions to refugees from Syria. NRC upgrades properties owned by Lebanese families who agree to host refugees rent-free for a period of up to 12 months.

Through outreach activities, NRC provides information on how to access services, and one-to-one advice and legal assistance on housing, land and property rights, legal status and civil documentation (e.g. birth certificates).

NRC offers catch-up classes to support integration of Syrian refugee children into Lebanese public schools and non-formal programmes for children not yet able to access formal schooling, as well as learning opportunities for youth.

In informal settlements NRC integrates water and sanitation, shelter and education programmes, and builds community capacity for self-management.



NRC is providing emergency response assistance to displaced and/or highly vulnerable populations with Shelter, NFI and WASH needs.

NRC is also providing education infrastructure, capacity building and onsite coaching and mentoring of teachers and is distributing teacher and student kits so children can continue their education in displacement.

NRC is providing emergency food assistance as well as support to restore or create income generation activities.

NRC is working on housing, land and property (HLP) rights to support shelter/WASH interventions inside Syria. See: Briefing Note: Housing, Land and Property rights in the Syrian Arab Republic.

JORDAN







NRC is the lead partner of UN-HCR in providing shelter and basic household items in Zaatari and Azraq refugee camps. NRC provides refugees with support upon arrival and operates the distribution area. NRC is also distributing cash and vouchers to offer beneficiaries more choice and flexibility.

NRC is working to ensure that children are able to get back to school and is also providing specialized youth programmes and catch up programmes.

NRC is providing financial incentives and support to Jordanian landlords to finish semi-constructed houses and bring new units onto the rental market, in return for housing refugee families.

NRC is providing information, counselling and community support activities to refugees in urban and camp settings.

IRAQ







As part of the UNICEF and WFP-led Rapid Response Mechanism, NRC is able to reach the most vulnerable and mobile populations in Iraq with urgent life-saving assistance.

NRC is one of the main cash actors in Iraq.

NRC is one of the main shelter actors in Iraq and supports rehabilitation of shelter in addition to implementing water and sanitation programs with a primary focus on non-camp settings.

NRC has established community outreach centres in several camps which function as hubs from where NRC works with groups at risk of gender-based violence.

NRC was one of the first actors to set up Education in Emergencies programmes across numerous camps in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq.

NRC provides Information, Counselling and Legal assistance for displaced populations across Iraq.
